#### Candidates Forum on 5/2/18

The League of Women Voters of Northampton County and Lehigh Counties are cosponsoring a Candidates' Forum on Wednesday, May 2,2018 at 7:00 pm until about 8:30 pm. The Forum is being hosted by the Northampton Community College and will take place in the Alumnae Hall on the main campus (3835 Green Pond Road, Bethlehem, PA 18020, Phone: 610.861.5300). Doors open at 6:30pm to allow some time to meet and greet your candidates. Parking is plentiful.

The Honorable Charles W. Dent of the former 15<sup>th</sup> Congressional District is retiring in 2018 after 13 years of service to Pennsylvania since 2005. In February of this year, as a result of a court petition brought by the League of Women Voters, et al, against the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, et al, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court has issued a remedial map which now puts Lehigh and Northampton Counties, and part of Monroe in a new district: the 7<sup>th</sup> US Congressional District.

Vying for the Congressional seat representing this new district are Republicans Dean Browning and Marty Nothstein of Lehigh County and six Democrat candidates: David Clark, Rick Daugherty and Greg Edwards (both of Lehigh), John Morganelli and Roger Ruggles of Northampton, and Susan Wild (Lehigh). All candidates are being invited to the May 2<sup>nd</sup> forum.

Bring your questions and learn which candidate fits your political interests. It promises to be a very interesting event! PBS plans on televising it as well.

It is important for voters to be informed in order to make the best choice possible. We are only a few weeks away from the May 15<sup>th</sup> elections. Be sure you are registered or your voter registration is up to date by the April 15<sup>th</sup> deadline if you are a US citizen, are 18 years of age on the day of the election and have lived in the district 30 days prior to the election. #### **Education Committee News**

AAUW-PA Public Policy started an Education Committee to work with those members specifically interested in Education issues. Whether it is school funding or cyber or charter schools, there is a lot of work going on concerning Education in our branches and/or much passion on the issue. Ann and Barbara hope to amplify the AAUW-PA voice by coordinating, sharing, and understanding the issues. All are welcome to join the AAUW-PA Education Committee. This is an opportunity to get someone involved in public policy issues for the first time.

So far six branches have identified an Education Liaison. The committee held its first conference call on March 8 with ten attending and two who later listened to the recording. The major topic covered was SB2, education savings accounts. We continue to watch whether SB383—allowing administrators and teachers to have guns in school—will go to the floor for a vote. It Passed in the Senate in 2017 and the House is sitting on it.

#### SB2 – Education Savings Accounts

From Education Voters PA: We are hearing chatter in Harrisburg that some lawmakers on the Senate Education Committee are itching to vote on Senate Bill 2, the education savings account voucher bill, sometime before they go on break in May.

Don't let the name of this Senate bill fool you. This is another school voucher scheme that will siphon taxpayer money away from public schools. **Based on the AAUW Public Policy Priority, AAUW-PA opposes SB2.** 

Anti-public education lawmakers are going to extreme lengths to move Senate Bill 2 out of committee. Republican leadership <u>rigged the makeup of the Senate Education Committee</u>, <u>one member sent out inaccurate information about the bill</u>, and now some lawmakers are hoping that a vote on Senate Bill 2 will fly under the radar. AAUW-PA continues to coordinate advocacy with Pennsylvanians Opposed to Vouchers and Education Voters PA, so watch for emails and Action Alerts.


