Time To Celebrate Women's Victory The Right To Vote

This year marks the 100th anniversary of Congress approving the 19th amendment giving all women the right to vote. As AAUW continues to advocate for equal rights for all, it's important to recognize a group of women who were fighting not only for gender but racial equality.

There were many women from the Alpha Suffrage Club for African American women who fought alongside with the suffragists. One of these women, Ida B. Wells, journalist and newspaper editor, founded the club; it was said that she spoke louder than most. She led the group to join the Women Suffrage Procession. She and many others marched alongside all the women from different groups. She is quoted as stating, "I am not doing it for recognition. I am doing it for the future benefits of my race."

As we celebrate and recognize all the women who fought, spoke and continued to advocate for the right of women to vote, it is important to understand the past and recognize all the incredible women who fought for our equality. We can extend Wells' statement to say that we do not do it for the recognition but for the future generations to come. The future generations should be aware of the 41 years of struggle to pass the 14th amendment and that there are many hidden histories of women who played an important role in making history.

"In 2020, we have an opportunity to celebrate the vote," Wagner said, "and also take accountability to rethink our history" (USA Today, March 6-8, 2020).

Public Policy News

This is the first time that all Pennsylvanians will have the choice to vote in person or apply for and send in the application for a mail in ballot. There are 211,183 registered voters in Northampton County but that doesn't mean that all of them vote. Pennsylvanians ranked 25th in the country in voter turnout for the 2018 mid term elections. Nine of the ten states with the highest voter turnout numbers have enacted same day registration or vote by mail policies.

Will the number of Pennsylvanians voting this year increase? Only time will tell.
