# From the Presidents' Pens

March 31 is All Women Equal Pay Day. And why is it March 31st? Because that is the day that symbolizes how far into the year the average women must work in order to earn what the average man earns in the previous year regardless of experience or job type.

When the Equal Pay Act was signed into law in 1963, fifty-seven years ago, women made 59 cents for every dollar a man made. Things are now better for women but not equal. Women now average about 82 cents on the dollar compared to what men make.

And let us not forget that Moms don't catch up until June 4<sup>th</sup>. African American women don't catch up until August 13<sup>th</sup>. Native American women don't catch up until October 1<sup>st</sup> and Latino women catch up on November 2<sup>nd</sup>.

AAUW worked hard last year to make the world better for women. More than 102,000 women were trained in salary negotiations. With a grant from the Coca-Cola Foundation we implemented Empower, a program designed to help women explore leadership roles. Through the Greatest Needs Fund which some of you contributed to, AAUW was able to respond to gender-equity AAUW led the effort to pass the challenges. Paycheck Fairness Act in the House in DC. They produced ground breaking research with The Simple Truth About the Gender Pay Gap study. AAUW awarded more than 4.3 million in fellowships and grants to support women around the globe.

Locally we are exploring having a Work Smart workshop to train women in salary negotiation. Our public policy team continues to work for

women's issues. They will visit local politicians at the end of March to continue to stress the need for equal pay in PA. You are welcome to come too. Anyone can be a two-minute activist and let your local officials know that you support the fight for fair pay. Our scholarships support the goals of young women to advance their professional dreams.

Kate Racculia is a novelist living in Bethlehem, Pa. She is the author of the novels Bellweather Rhapsody, winner of the American Library Association's Alex Award and This Must Be The Place. Her third novel, Tuesday Mooney Talks to Ghosts, was published by Houghton Mifflin Harcourt in October 2019. In a life of many jobs and occupations, she currently teaches online for Boston's nonprofit writing community Grub Street, works at the Bethlehem Area Public Library, and sings in the Bach Choir of Bethlehem.



Elvira Woodruff is the author of many popular books for children. She has published picture books, historical fiction, and fantasy novels for middle grade readers, as well as a knitting book for adults, *To Knit or Not to Knit.* Her work has won many awards and honors. Elvira's presentations on creative writing have taken her across the country, speaking at schools and conferences alike. She currently lives in Martins Creek, Pa.



Donald L. # **Twelve Angry Jurors**

Shelton will be appearing in the play "Twelve Angry Jurors" at the Pennsylvania Playhouse in Bethlehem. The adaptation features both men and women, hence the title change.

This gripping courtroom drama follows a jury of 12 people whose morals and values are challenged as they deliberate the fate of a teenager accused of killing his father.
